# **VLP News**

VLP was fortunate to receive COVID relief funds to assist individuals with housing stability matters. The funding for this programming was ended slightly earlier than anticipated which ended our ability to continue judicare support to volunteers in these housing stability matters. These funds helped VLP run its morning Eviction Help Desk which operates almost every morning that the Court is open from 8am-9am.

Approximately only 1.2% of tenants have representation at eviction hearings, where loss of housing and risk of homelessness is at stake (according to 2022 civil court data). Under the aforementioned grant, VLP, along with other Pro Bono Indiana offices, assisted in serving 5,000 individuals with eviction related issues at its housing clinics across the state. PBI navigators and staff assisted in navigating and wrap-around services to another 5,278 individuals with eviction related issues. PBI staff and volunteer attorneys directly served 1,425 of those individuals outside of clinics.

Thank you to the Indiana Housing and Community Development Authority, the Indiana Bar Foundation, fellow legal aid programs, community partners, and volunteers who helped make this programming possible and valuable. VLP continues to try to help people in need with these matters, with the assistance of volunteers, with services like our Eviction Help Desk. If you are interested in volunteering to help us at this clinic, let us know.




