In the midst of all this, though, in a time of hard work and preparation for year end, it is all too easy to forget, or at least postpone, our commitment to helping those without sufficient access to the justice system. I will commend to you VLP's article in this *Summation* about Talk To A Lawyer and Mike Keating's years of service. I hope that the Talk To A Lawyer signup sheets will quickly fill.

I am pleased that we raised over \$5,000 at our virtual trivia night which will be split evenly between the Legal Aid Society and Volunteer Lawyer Program, but I hope that we can also fill the pro bono needs of the most vulnerable. There are several VLP applicants who need help with access to legal services. I list those below.

Applicant 5538 – Applicant is an income qualified senior citizen seeking help to create basic estate planning documents: will and power of attorney for health care.

Applicant 3231 – Applicant's mother passed away in August and she and her siblings need help to probate her estate in order to keep her Habitat for Humanity home in their family. Applicant and her children lived with the mother and Applicant indicates all siblings are in agreement.

Applicant 0170 – Applicant seeks help to obtain an expungement of their criminal record. It appears that the last criminal charges were from 2012 and that the Applicant qualifies for the action.

Applicant 1111 – Applicant seeks assistance to obtain a divorce. Parties have a child but no major assets or pensions.

I would love to be able to report next month that a lawyer who has not yet this year agreed to take on a pro bono case has accepted each of those cases. Yes, there is one less applicant in the list since I told Scott I would accept one.

I hope each of you had a good Thanksgiving, that you and yours enjoy the holidays and have a safe and prosperous new year.
